





The Heisler Public library is a proud member of the Parkland Regional Library system, a cooperative of 49 public libraries across central Alberta. With your free Heisler library membership, you are a member of all other libraries and have access to their services.

The Heisler Public Library is governed by trustees appointed by the Village of Heisler. Our board chair is Lorie Zimmer and the library manager is Dixie Wolbeck. Library board meetings are open to the public. Board members are: Lorie Zimmer, Janice Badry, Val Volk, Bernice Dale, Nadine Massong, Kelly Williams, Danielle Wolbeck and Bonnie Wood (Village liaison). Anyone interested in joining the library board is quite welcome. Get in touch with any of the board members. Meetings are 4 times per year.

There will be major changes to the County Children's book kit. The County will no longer be funding this County Library Board (not to be confused with our Heisler or PRL library board). Council approved to discontinue funding of \$6,000 to the Flagstaff Library Board.

The library will continue to be closed to the public until restrictions are lifted. Please continue to go on-line to www.heislerlibrary.prl.ab.ca and order books, e-books, and more. You can also e-mail the library at heislerlibrary@prl.ab.ca and Dixie will respond to your requests. Curb side pick-up is used and if you live in town Dixie will bring and pick up books at your home. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

A member of the Inter-Municipal Assessment Review Board must successfully complete a training program. A member of the Inter-Municipal Review Board should have:

- A personal history of acting ethically and with integrity
- An understanding of the principles of administrative law and natural justice
- The ability to participate in hearings with an open mind making decisions in a fair and unbiased manner
- The ability to write in plain language
- Excellent analytical and reasoning skills
- The ability to speak in public and communicate effectively with parties to the appeal
- Demonstrable ability to read, understand and apply complex plans, the *Municipal Government Act* and other pertinent Acts

TIME COMMITMENT

- The term is three years
- Complaints can only be submitted within 60 days of assessment notices being mailed and hearings are scheduled after that term has expired
- Meetings can be held during business hours or in the evening, whichever time frame better suits the majority board members
- Board members are expected to read the hearing materials prior to the meetings

TRAINING

- Training is coordinated and provided by Municipal Government Board (MGB)
- ARB Members are required to attend training sessions
- Training sessions are three days in length and will require travel to a training session as scheduled by the Province of Alberta

REMUNERATION

- Remuneration is provided for meeting attendance
- Reimbursement for travel expenses and out of pocket expenses directly related to hearings or training sessions is provided
