

- To move the wheel stops at the post office at a minimum spacing of 3 feet as soon as the weather allows in consultation with the post office.
- To accept the follow up letter from the Minister of Municipal Affairs Tracy L. Allard; stating that the Minister has decided to revisit the 2016 petitioned request for a viability review for the Village of Heisler, and that the Minister has directed the ministry to complete a follow-up to the 2017 viability screening to determine if the Village of Heisler would benefit from a viability review at this time as information.
- To approve the Armstrong Waterwell Drilling invoice in the amount of \$832.65 as unbudgeted expense.
- To approve the Forster Hydrovac Services invoice in the amount of \$1,944.73 as unbudgeted expense.
- To instruct the CAO to pay CAO travel expenses for June 16-October 5, 2020 in the amount of \$135.00.
- To instruct the CAO to pay Mayor Bonnie Wood meeting & travel expenses for September 15 – December 17, 2020 in the amount of \$640.00.
- To approve the 2020 fire operating expenses for Heisler Firemen in the amount of \$2,560.
- To approve the 2020 expenses for Heisler Fire Chief in the amount of \$720.00.
- To approve the 2020 Heisler Firemen meeting expenses in the amount of \$750.00.
- To approve the 2020 Fire Chief honorarium in the amount of \$450.00.
- To approve the 2020 Director of Emergency Management honorarium in the amount of \$100.00.



ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

A member of the Inter-Municipal Assessment Review Board must successfully complete a training program. A member of the Inter-Municipal Review Board should have:

- A personal history of acting ethically and with integrity
- An understanding of the principles of administrative law and natural justice
- The ability to participate in hearings with an open mind making decisions in a fair and unbiased manner
- The ability to write in plain language
- Excellent analytical and reasoning skills
- The ability to speak in public and communicate effectively with parties to the appeal
- Demonstrable ability to read, understand and apply complex plans, the *Municipal Government Act* and other pertinent Acts

TIME COMMITMENT

- The term is three years
- Complaints can only be submitted within 60 days of assessment notices being mailed and hearings are scheduled after that term has expired
- Meetings can be held during business hours or in the evening, whichever time frame better suits the majority board members
- Board members are expected to read the hearing materials prior to the meetings

TRAINING

- Training is coordinated and provided by Municipal Government Board (MGB)
- ARB Members are required to attend training sessions
- Training sessions are three days in length and will require travel to a training session as scheduled by the Province of Alberta

REMUNERATION

- Remuneration is provided for meeting attendance
- Reimbursement for travel expenses and out of pocket expenses directly related to hearings or training sessions is provided


