The Path to Rural Small-Town Alberta by resident Mark Crump



We had been living in Central America for 5 years. It was time to begin a new chapter in our life, we both sensed it, yet failed to discuss it together. Neither of us wanted to extinguish our partners' dream. WE discovered this little village called Heisler – a place that many life long Albertans cannot tell you, where it is located or even if it exists. We both were ready for peace and quiet, living only a few hundred metres from the singular main traversing highway from North America to South America. Discovered one afternoon while we were on a video tour of a possible residence in Forestburg, with our realtor, all from the kitchen table of our casita in Nicaragua. Liza was on her phone, on Google Maps, doing one of those multi searches she is always so much better at- than am I. WE interrupted our video call with the realtor and asked him to postpone the virtual viewing set up for Bashaw the following day, to get to this little bungalow in Heisler... instead. She seemed to find a hidden gem which had only been listed a few days. It looked almost too perfect, right size, small town location, in the middle of these beautiful ranch lands and prairie grasses. Perfect match to our simple need – Peace + Quiet in a small town environment, in Alberta.

We made our first exploratory visit one day following the mandated guarantine period upon our return. We were both already vaccinated in Nicaragua, however at that moment in time, the injections which Liza received had not been accepted by the Canadian Government, thus a 14 day period of isolation in a really pathetic AirBnb in downtown Edmonton. (We would both proceed to be double vaccinated as soon as we could- with the Pfizer vaccine, commencing on our arrival that September Saturday.) We headed to Heisler one very sunny Friday fall morning and were pleasantly surprised at what we were viewing for the very first time (in person). We stopped into the Post Office, met Val and introduced ourselves, then over to the General Store and met Rebecca, took a short drive around, went by the house, Bernice was sitting near the garden cleaning vegetables from what we could see as we drove by. Three weeks more passed, we finally took possession of our own "Little house on the prairies." After a multitude of truck trips from Edmonton with our life in tow, out of storage finally after all this time. Much washing and airing out whilst the few possessions were slowly gathered and sorted out once more. Ever so slowly, the bungalow is coming together. We both are "A" personalities who come from pressure cooker careers where we both thrived on the intensity of the velocity required to go forward at our rapid pace.

First impressions, the Village was PERFECT. Main Street with a General Store, a few benches, a few streetlamps, no crowding and so much more than seen in many small towns, this Village has charm and character. Simplicity. Necessities. Even a great restaurant (Cannot wait to dine out again- Kelly, a master chef, with a flare for creating some very tasty special-ties, served by a lovely young woman Katie) Really cold beer. What more could an old codger as I am, ask for? A reminder of my younger man's career start.. rail tank cars with PROCOR along the siding spur- how befitting of a young man getting transferred to Edmonton so many long years ago... to work within their new repair facility on 34th Street right down from Imperial Oil ! PLUS, that lonesome whistle of a train going through in the prairie countryside a few times each day. The list is filled only with check marks, it seems. The church, sitting pristinely across the field to our south – although not a religious person, I do hope we can hear those church bells ringing over the Holidays.

Traffic – there is none, what could be better than that ? I sit near the front window of the living room often, many days and evenings, I could count on one hand- the amount of vehicles which pass by our new home. We have been fortunate to meet a few of the friendliest folks in this village. Heidi and Megara, in the Village Admin. Offices as well as a few of the village folks, all with welcome handshakes and a smile. Helpful as could be, Liza gets around more than do I, but I am certain in time, I too shall meet some of those same folks and enjoy their welcoming hospitality.

A brief summary of moving to this Village of Heisler – we are very pleased with everything we see, the small town sense whilst being close enough to Forestburg and Daysland if needed. Friendly, interesting people. PEACE + QUIET. Beautiful park with walking trails, a great looking ball diamond where we hope to see some good amateur baseball, Looking for-

ward to sitting at one of Kelly's outside tables and enjoying a cold one or two on a Saturday afternoon in the sunshine. Looking forward to walking that entire perimeter trail, looking forward to enjoying this Village, (without much more of moving, unpacking, sorting, storing and arranging furniture in our little bungalow).

I truly hope we meet someday soon.


