- To renew the Assessment Services contract with Wainwright Assessment Group Ltd. and to approve the 2020-2022 annual rates of \$3,840.
- To accept the letter of Municipal Affairs, stating that the Village of Heisler has been selected to participate in a Municipal Accountability Program (MAP) in 2020 as information.
- To decide to not withdraw from the Regional SCADA Project.
- To accept the information for the passed GST and PSB Bodies Audit for January 1, 2017 to June 30, 2019; hold in November as information.
- To adopt the 2019 Village of Heisler Operating Budget as the Interim Operating Budget for 2020.
- To approve the proposed Flagstaff Family & Community Services 2020 budget with Heisler's requisition of \$1,392.
- To approve the proposed Flagstaff Regional Solid Waste Management Association 2020 Budget Version 2 with a \$25,163.49 requisition for Heisler.
- To accept the 2020 Lodge requisition of \$1,050.00 for senior's housing from Flagstaff Regional Housing Group, as presented.
- To rescind Motion 820/19 from July 29, 2019 and to not commit to fund \$2,000.00 per year for the Community Resource Officer Position; due to the cost of the rural policing initiative from the province.

CN Police want you to Stay Safe this Winter

No matter where you live, chances are you will face some challenging driving conditions in the months ahead. Freezing rain, snow, sleet and whiteouts can make winter driving downright dangerous.

In fact, according to the Transportation Safety Board, there's a spike in railway crossing incidents during the winter months. This is due to many factors, including:

- Ice and snow making it harder for drivers to stop and manoeuvre their vehicles;
- Snowy roads that hide pavement markings;
- Blowing snow, fog, and sleet that reduce visibility;
- Snowbanks and snow in trees reducing sight lines;

Reducing the likelihood of being in a serious car accident in winter starts with proper planning and knowing your rail-safety basics.

Following these simple tips can help keep you safe when you encounter train tracks this winter:

Plan ahead and check the weather forecast before travelling—not only for your current location, but also for your final destination. If conditions deteriorate while you're on the road, stop at the nearest town or rest area and wait until it's safe to continue driving.

Reduce your speed when road conditions are poor. Always slow down well in advance of a railway crossing. The more time you have to react, the better chance you have of avoiding a collision.

Avoid distractions when approaching railway crossings turn off your radio and heating fans so you can listen for trains. Reduced visibility and sounds from a storm can make it more difficult to see and hear if a train is coming. Roll down your window—especially if it's frosty or foggy—and look both ways before crossing the tracks.

Look for railway warning signs and signals snow may cover train tracks at a crossing, making them look like the road. Look for warning signs and other indications that there is a railway crossing ahead so you can prepare to stop, especially when driving at night.

Use winter tires they have treads designed to grip ice and snow, so you will be less likely to slide on the road or into the side of a train. All-season tires can begin to lose their traction when the temperature drops below 7°C.

Don't drive impaired alcohol and drugs such as marijuana reduce your ability to pay attention, react quickly and make safe driving choices.

Remember "any time is train time". Be rail-smart this winter: Look. Listen. Live.

Faith makes all things possible. Hope makes all things work. Love makes everything beautiful. May you have an abundance of all three & more, every day in 2020. May there always be peace in your heart & love and laughter in your home.

Every occupant or owner of any residential property shall within seventy-two (72) hours

(excluding Sundays and holidays) after a snowfall, remove all snow and ice from any sidewalk

adjacent to the said property pursuant to the Snow Removal Bylaw.

If you are going to be away, please ensure someone shovels your sidewalk and please do not string electrical cords (for block heaters, etc.) across sidewalks.

# Volunteer Training Weekend

Every year the Hospice Society of Camrose & District offers a training program that is open to the public. You are welcome to participate, whether you choose to become a volunteer or not; first seats are reserved for those intending to complete volunteer registration.

The purpose of this training is to prepare you for service as a care volunteer: • to individuals in their home with a chronic disease • to those in long-term-care or hospitals who have a palliative diagnosis • to those who are actively dying • to those who are grieving.

Those choosing to become registered volunteers will be interviewed, asked to supply references, and to provide a criminal record check. Training occurs via online modules, several evening classes through the year, and one full weekend. Noon meals are provided Saturday and Sunday of the weekend training.
