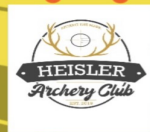

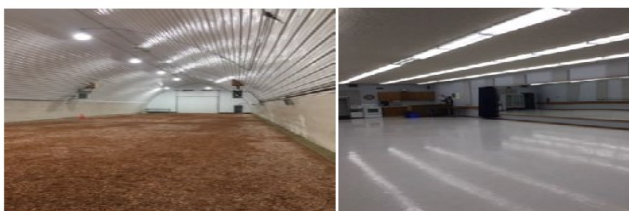

The Village of Heisler has seen a lot of weeds throughout the Community. Please make sure your property is free from weeds to help control the problem in our community. Below is a list of prohibited noxious weeds that **must be destroyed**. For more Information, please visit the County of Flagstaff website: www.flagstaff.ca

Weeds in Alberta are legislated through the **Weed Control Act**, which contains 75 regulated weeds categorized as **prohibited noxious** and **noxious**. Prohibited noxious weeds are those that must be destroyed to prevent their establishment and spread, while noxious weeds must be controlled to prevent their proliferation. The legislation empowers municipalities and landowners to take action against these invasive plants, aiming to protect natural ecosystems, agricultural productivity, and biodiversity. Under the Act, landowners and occupants are legally responsible for managing weed infestations on their property, and failure to comply may result in enforcement actions and penalties.

46 Prohibited Noxious Weeds – must be **destroyed** upon detection

29 Noxious Weeds – must be **controlled** and prevented from spreading

Flagstaff County has adopted a bylaw designating **absinthe wormwood** (*Artemisia absinthium*) as a **noxious weed**. This means the weed is subject to control measures under both the County's local bylaw and Alberta's Weed Control Act

<p>Prohibited noxious weeds Under the Weed Control Act prohibited noxious weeds must be destroyed.</p> <p>The following plants are designated as prohibited noxious weeds; this includes the plant's seeds. Prohibited noxious weeds pose a serious threat as they spread rapidly and are highly competitive.
