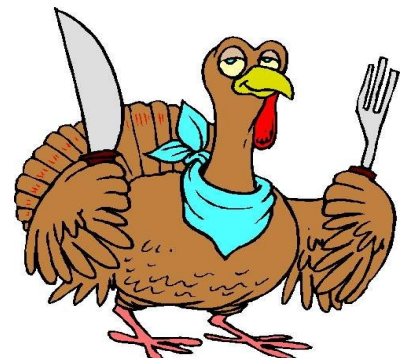

Woher stammt Thanksgiving?

There are several theories about the origin of Thanksgiving, but one assumption has been established; from the time of the pioneers and pilgrims, reminiscent of a celebration between the pilgrims and the local native tribes or indigenous people and reminds of the basic idea of gratitude and the cozy get-together.

Interlibrary Loans

Borrow print and audio books, movies, music, CDs, game discs and even journal and newspaper articles from libraries across the province. [Request online](#) using your Parkland Regional Library card number and PIN or ask library staff to find / request items for you. We will look far and wide – beyond Alberta and even internationally – to track down specific items and contact you when your item arrives so you can pick it up.

Photocopying / Printing

The library can satisfy your need for black and white copying/printing for \$0.25 per page. Colour copies may also be available at an additional charge. Just ask us!

Borrowed materials can be returned to any public library. All this free!

You will also receive a library bag crafted by a local board member!

Our "Free little library" in the lobby of the post office is getting a lot of use. You can keep any book from it and if you wish to donate a book back into it please do so. These are discarded books and are not in the Parkland system.

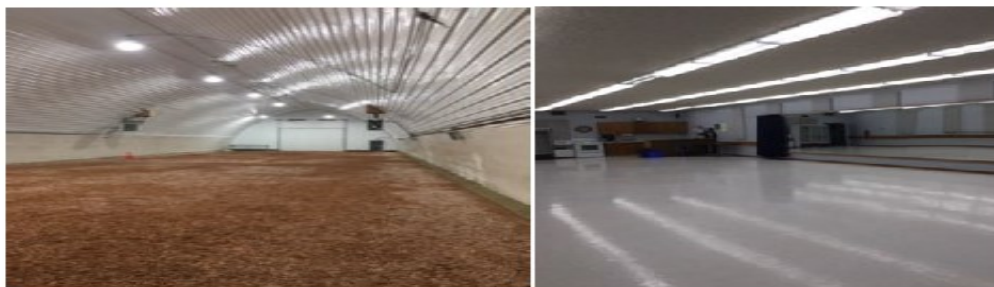

In 2018, **7,254** Albertans visited the Emergency Department for **suicide attempts**. **50%** of all visits were made by **YOUTH**, ages 0-24.



3 out of **4** suicide deaths are male. Almost **50%** are middle-aged men, ages 40-64.

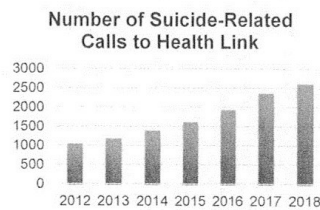
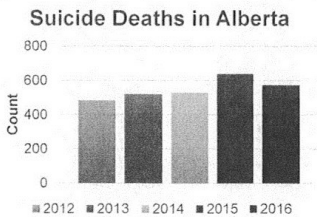


63-67% of **LGBTQ+** youth, ages 14-25, report thoughts about suicide.



Suicide is **5 to 6X** higher for **Indigenous youth** than non-Indigenous youth.

Every year, more Albertans die by suicide than the number of people who die in motor vehicle collisions.
